

Ten students and two teachers went on a study tour in New Zealand from 16th July to 31st July, 2015. We studied at Kaipara College and stayed with six home stay families in Helensville, Auckland. The study tour helped broaden visions and understand different cultures of all participants.

The two-week study program started with a warm welcome party organized by the International Department and Maori students. Our students played games and sang songs with the Maori student leaders excitedly. The diversified study program included Maori culture, cooking, history, geographical features, flora and fauna in New Zealand. I was deeply impressed by the

knowledge, methodology and passion of our teacher, Ms. Sandy Wendt. A widerange of well-designed learning, exploring and self-reflecting activities were facilitated by Ms. Wendt. For

> instance, we enjoyed a bush walk in Warkworth, had lunch on Muriwai beach, played with the kids in a kindergarten, visited a Honey Bee Farm and observed different exotic trees

> and birds in Woodhill Forest. These are all extraordinary learning experiences to us.

With a cross-curricular approach, different topics were covered in the lessons. Some of our students are knowledgeable enough to share and discuss different topics. For example, our discussions covered global warming, environmental protection and endangered species. Towards the end of the program, students shared their views on living in New Zealand through a debate session.

Students were more confident of using English to express themselves in a different learning environment. Not only did our students have lots of conversations with Ms. Wendt, but

they also enjoyed science, visual arts, physical education and music lessons together with their New Zealand buddies. Students met their buddies every day and shared their lives and traditions in Hong Kong while having lunch together.

Apart from learning at school, we had lots of memorable moments with our home stay families. Different family day activities were arranged during the weekends. To my surprise, our students cooked delicious Chinese dinner for their home stay parents. Students were well-prepared and had practised cooking the Chinese dishes several times at home before the trip. It was a real cultural exchange.







We will miss our friends in New Zealand. It was a wonderful experience to share with my ten lovely students. Also, I was much appreciated to see our students are motivated, self-disciplined and independent in the study tour. I hope that more study tours in different places of the world will be provided for our students in the near future.








School Welcome party



Today, I met many friends there and Nick is my buddy. We played hockey in the P.E. lesson which was exciting because I have never played hockey before but it is a bit dangerous.








## Reflections from students

I think the biggest cultural differences between New Zealand and Hong Kong are the education system and the environment.
